### News from Classes:

**Robins** - Robins have begun their new topic 'New Life' by reading 'The Tiny Seed' by Eric Carle and planting cress and sunflower seeds. At Forest School we looked for early signs of Spring and found catkins, snowdrops, daffodils and primroses.

**Kingfishers** - Kingfishers have returned from their half-term break fired up with our new topic, On Safari! Already Mrs Jones has enjoyed some really super show and tell items and experiences shared by the children. We are now looking to create a safari theme in our classroom. So far this week we have created animal prints using shaving foam and food colouring and looked at some African art inspired by Edward Tingatinga. We have been exploring using oil pastels to create interesting fruit observational pictures and used watercolours to create beautiful African sunsets.

**Owls** - Owls had a great time at forest school on Tuesday. We set up a map of the forest school site for the children and they had to find different objects by using the key and their map skills. There has also been a huge amount of excitement around 'Spellodrome' and Year 4 were ranked as 24<sup>th</sup> in the world for number of points gained as a class. Many of our children were also included in the top 100 individuals. Almost everyone has had a go and enjoyed it.

**Eagles** - The Eagles have been learning all about forces this week. We have so far covered the different types of pushes and pulls and have just started looking at gravity in more depth. We learned about Sir Isaac Newton and how it is said he discovered gravity. Gabriel asked why he named it 'gravity' so we talked about the origins of words and word roots, and that the word 'gravity' comes from the Latin 'gravis', meaning heavy. We used some Newton metres and discovered a link between weight (N) and mass (g).
