

Gretton Primary School Pupil Premium Overview

At Gretton Primary School we aim to ensure that the careful investment of our Pupil Premium Grant results in the inclusion of our disadvantaged children in all areas of school life and the acceleration their academic progress. This provision is reviewed on a regular basis and we look closely at interventions that have taken place and their impact, modifying our approach if necessary. We identify what interventions or support is needed based on the current needs of individual disadvantaged children, as well as their families.

The funding is used to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between their achievement and that of their peers. Our Pupil Premium Spending Plan provides a more detailed summary of how we are using this funding in order to achieve this outcome.

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Potential Barriers to Learning

Attendance	The attendance of our disadvantaged children is broadly in line with other groups largely because they enjoy coming to school.
Attitudes to School and Learning	The attitude to school and learning of all our disadvantaged children is excellent because they receive excellent support and they enjoy nearly aspects of school life.
Access and Engagement	Our disadvantaged children always come to school ready to learn and give their best. We try to provide regular additional support from skilled staff for those children with specific learning needs
Parental Engagement	Parental engagement is usually very good and we always try to provide support or signpost families to where they can access advice. Our Learning Mentor, SENCo and all teachers are accessible and approachable.
Inclusion and Enrichment	A proportion of our disadvantaged children do not readily access extra-curricular clubs and some parents have difficulty financing educational visits. Therefore we ensure that all our disadvantaged children have the opportunity to access the range of different experiences available to them. We believe this will then have a positive impact on their self-esteem, emotional well-being and learning.
